Meet the Speakers

Cody Coyne



Rev Cody Coyne was appointed minister at Cross Street Unitarian Chapel in 2015. In addition to his ministry, he serves on the executive of the Manchester District Associaion, the Unitarian Peace Fellowship, and the Faith Network for Manchester. He is also a participant in Manchester's "Challenging Hate Forum," an inter-faith and inter-civic group working to combat hate crime. Cody lives in north Manchester with his wife Catherine and son Thomas. Beyond ministry, music plays an important part in his life.

Kate Dean



Rev Kate Dean trained at HMCO and Heythrop College. She is a Unitarian minister serving Rosslyn Hill Chapel, Hampstead in north London. She has a creative background, having studied design at University, and has organised a number of creativity groups. She is inspired by earth-centred spirituality, the mystics from the East and West as well as the creative arts. As well as leading Sunday services, her spiritual community at Rosslyn Hill Chapel offers Sunday afternoon spirituality workshops and monthly Death Cafes, evening meditation gatherings and monthly groups for under-5s.

Robin Hanford



Originally from Sussex, Robin was drawn to Unitarianism though its inclusive ethos – both in terms of diversity of belief and its LGBTQI+ inclusive and affirming nature.

Robin leads worship at Great Meeting most weeks as well as being pastorally available for friends and members of the congregation as well as the people of Hinckley and beyond. He also leads rights of passage at the Chapel including Christenings/Baptisms/Naming Ceremonies, Weddings, and Funerals.

Peter Hewis



Before training for the ministry at the Unitarian College, Peter spent three years playing cornet then French Horn with the Band of the 2nd Bn Parachute Regiment then he had three ministries; Bethnal Green for seven years, Hinckley for twenty nine years and finally at Harris Manchester College as the Chaplain, Bursar, Tutor in Ministerial Training and Minister to the Unitarian Chapel Society. Peter also spent a six-month exchange at Knoxville, Tennessee in 1970 and a further six months as the interim minister in 1980.

In 1991-2 he was the President of the General Assembly, for more than twenty years he was Secretary of the North (now East) Midland District Association and for twenty years he was Secretary of the Ministers' Benevolent Society. Nowadays he plays Tenor Horn with Yarnton Brass Band and is the Band President.

His wife Heddwen is a retired NHS Nutritionist and Dietitian who specialised in the treatment of HIV/AIDS patients.

Claire MacDonald



Claire MacDonald joins Harris Manchester as Chaplain and Unitarian Ministry Tutor from a background in both congregational ministry and the arts. She comes to HMC from Lewisham Unity in South London, where she served as minister from 2017 to 2022. In 2015-17, she trained as a minister at Harris Manchester while completing an MA at Heythrop College, University of London, focused on the impact of modernity on the three Abrahamic faiths. She also earned a BA in English from the University of Leeds and a PhD in Critical and Creating Writing at the University of East Anglia.

Tobias Tanton



Tobias studied at the Australian National University and originally worked in commerce and information technology before turning to academic theology. He took his third bachelor's degree at Charles Sturt University, and his postgraduate degrees in Oxford, first as an Ertegun Scholar and MPhil student at Harris Manchester, and then as a DPhil student and holder of the Arthur Peacocke Graduate Studentship in Science and Religion at Exeter College. He held a postdoctoral fellowship in the Faculty of Divinity at Cambridge (2017 – 2018), and from 2018-2022 was Lecturer in Theology at Ripon College Cuddesdon.

Matthew Weait



Matthew is Director of the Department, Professor of Law and Society, and Governing Body Fellow of Harris Manchester College. He has a longstanding commitment to promoting higher and continuing educational opportunities for non-traditional learners, and to equality, diversity, and inclusion in higher education.
